WHAT IS HOARDING?

Hoarding is the compulsive buying or acquiring of free things, coupled with the inability to discard even items seemingly without value. Clutter is the end result of acquiring and saving is a symptom of the disorder. Hoarding poses health risks (fires, injuries from falling, unsanitary living conditions, inability to use rooms as intended-kitchens, bedrooms, bathrooms) and affects entire families and communities. It is a brain disorder that may have a genetic component, can begin as early as six years old and occurs across all socioeconomic groups. Those who hoard often experience grief-like feelings of loss in response to getting rid of anything. It affects between 2-4% of the population which is about 5,000 – 12,500 people in Marin County alone.
