





Overview – Behavioral Health and Recovery Services






- Marin DMC-ODS serves approximately 750 unduplicated Medi-Cal beneficiaries annually
- In CY 2019 and 2020, 49% of clients receiving substance use services reported a co-occurring mental health condition
- Substance Use Services

DMC-ODS Overview

- In April 2017, Marin County opted into a five-year demonstration waiver to operate the Drug/Medi-Cal program as an organized delivery system. The intent of the DMC-ODS pilot was to demonstrate how organized substance use disorder care improves successful outcomes while decreasing other system health care costs.
- DMC-ODS will improve access to and quality of care for Marin Medi-Cal beneficiaries by:
 - Enhancing the **Continuum of Substance Use Disorder (SUD)Services** and expanding access to—and Federal Medicaid reimbursement for—services
 - Using the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) Criteria to ensure that beneficiaries are in the most appropriate level of care
 - Coordinating with mental health and primary care to ensure integrated care
 - Requiring providers to deliver care utilizing Evidence Based Practices (EBPs)
 - Expands workforce capacity by allowing licensed practitioners of the healing arts (LPHAs) to determine medical necessity and to direct treatment plans
 - Acts as a managed care plan for SUD treatment services
 - DMC-ODS was renewed through 2026 as part of CalAIM

Expanded Programs & Funding

In April 2017, Marin became the third county in California to opt into a pilot program, referred to as the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS). The DMC-ODS functions as a managed care plan for the continuum of substance use treatment and recovery support services, which is modeled after the American Society of Addition Medicine criteria. The DMC-ODS makes improvements to the substance use service delivery system, which are intended to increase successful outcomes for beneficiaries while decreasing other system health care costs. The DMC-ODS has been renewed through 2026 as part of the CalAIM initiative. For additional information, visit DHCS DMC-ODS.









DMC-ODS and CalAIM – What's Next

DMC-ODS Renewal 2021-2026

- Implementation of Contingency Management Pilot
 - Evidence-Based Practice for Stimulant Use Disorders
 - Implement in Outpatient/OTP Sites (July 2022- March 2024)
 - Note: In FY 2020-21, 49% of beneficiary admissions to substance use services indicated stimulants as a primary or secondary substance
- Implementation of Certified Peer Support Specialists (July 2022)
- Expansion of Services Reimbursable through DMC-ODS
 - Early Intervention for Youth (under 21 years of age)
 - Clinical Consultation
- Behavioral Health Administrative Integration








Fentanyl-related Deaths in Select Bay Area Counties


