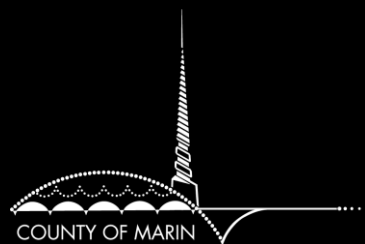

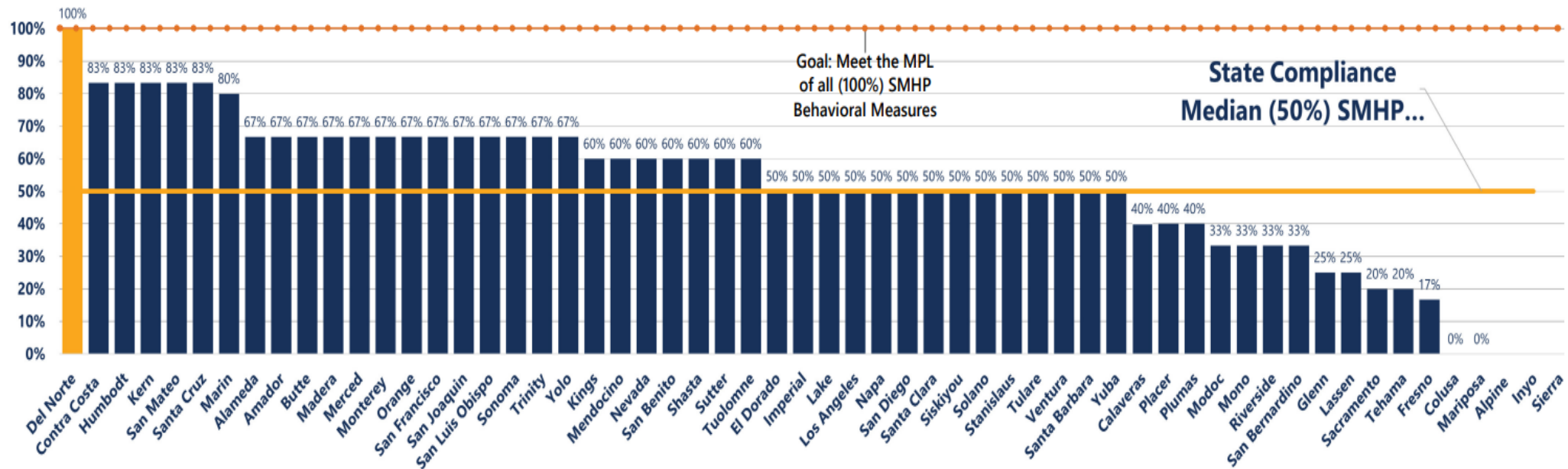
CalAIM Justice Involved Initiative

- California pursued a waiver from CMS to allow 90 days of Medi-Cal billable services while incarcerated. This is the first in the nation.
- Correctional facilities may begin providing billable healthcare as soon as October 1, 2024, and no later than October 1, 2026.
- County behavioral health agencies are required to implement Behavioral Health Linkages for incarcerated people no later than October 1, 2024. Includes assessments for mental health and substance use disorders, warm handoffs to treatment providers after release from custody.
- Implementation plan and readiness assessment due to the state on March 31, 2024.

DHCS County BH Plans - Ratings

- Marin County rated 7th in the state for meeting Healthcare Effectiveness Data Information Set (HEDIS) indicators for mental health plans
- Only 16% of counties exceeded 75% standard, including Marin

DHCS County BH Plans - Ratings

- Marin County tied (with 46 other counties) for top rating for DMC-ODS plans
- 0% of DMC-ODS counties exceeded 75%; 82% of DMC-ODS counties met 50%
