VIII. Division of Public Health Report

- Linda Dobra from the Prevention Program will be appointed the appointed seat for the County
- Ryan White Part B funding has been made available by the State Office of AIDS, and has been awarded to The Spahr Center/Marin AIDS Project to support psychosocial support groups for the following groups: long-term survivors, women, and Latino and their families.
- The 2014-15 annual client satisfaction surveys have been sent out to all Ryan White clients who have opted-in as share clients and to receiving mail. If there are any clients that you know of who are not share clients or who do not receive mail normally from the County, Kevin has copies of the survey that clients can access. Clients receive a \$20 gift card for completion of the surveys.
- SF HIV Health Services published a Resource Guide that has information about all HIV-related resources that are available to Ryan White clients. It will also be posted on the SF HIV Health Services website.
- National Women and Girls HIV/AIDS Awareness Day is March 10, National Native HIV/AIDS Awareness Day is March 20.
- SF HIV Health services Marin COLA presentation:
 - The community outreach and listening activities (COLA) is like a mini
 needs assessment. Between Marin and San Mateo counties, there
 were about 40 clients and 12 providers. The sample size was small so
 the findings aren't necessarily statistically significant, but provide a
 snapshot.
 - General findings indicate the following:
 - Long waits for dental services
 - Limited range of peer support services in the county
 - Only one benefits counselor for the entire county
 - Need for Spanish-speaking mental health therapists
 - Clients often don't show up for mental health services, which can be a drain on mental health resources
 - Aging services aren't connected to HIV services
 - Barriers to care exist such as linguistic, transportation, lack of resources, lack of public hospital
 - Clients are only offered one choice for case management services
