Estimated timetable to completion is 18 months. ○ Starting 3-year community planning process for Mental Health Services Act. Spending a great amount of time in empowering local communities to participate. • DJ Pierce <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Federal government will begin reimbursing an expanded level of county AOD services. ○ Fostering strong communication with contract providers in preparation to begin services. ○ Hired two new staff members: David Escobar, who will assume an already established Justice Coordinator position. Scott Awry, responsible for supervising a co-occurring disorder department. ○ A new independent contractor has been hired for Adult and Aging Services. ○ Slight amount of money has been taken from adult services and moved to adolescent services to increase partial hospitalization and residential treatment with Sunny Hills Services. Expanded services will probably take effect in December 2016 or January 2017. ○ On schedule with the tentative completion of the new detox center. ○ Adult and Youth Alliance event at MCOE on August 30th. 160 people in attendance. Marijuana use was a hot topic. 50/50 attendance split between youth and adults.

Class is almost at capacity at 40 people. ○ On December 9 RxSafe will host its annual community event at the Marin County Office of Education. ○ Counterfeit medication is floating around the state of CA and tremendous damage can occur from just a single pill. ○ Commented on the organization Compassionate Friends of Marin composed of individuals who have lost family members. ○ Comprehensive plan being finalized for the distribution of Narcan to County organizations that provide youth services. ○ Next DEA drug take-back day is October 22nd.
