Announcements:	
 Commissioner Hagerty and Dick Spotswood, a political columnist, are planning a televised debate sometime over the summer regarding housing issues. More to come on that item later. Chair Marchese gave some information regarding the recent history of housing development in Marin. This committee needs to brainstorm housing ideas and give it to legislators as a packet. There is fertile ground for the committee to lead the way on. The Chair asked Bortel to draft a paragraph regarding necessary information that may be obtained in the next Area Plan Needs Assessment. The discussion on this topic will continue in a future meeting. Bortel reported that his membership on the TAM Citizens Oversite Committee as a member of the Paratransit Coordinating Council will be coming to an end. It is expected that he will be reinstated under some other category. Measure A will extend the half cent sales tax for 30 years. This item will be on the ballot in November. The June primary ballot will include a regional measure to raise the bridge tolls to help finance. Measure B, the \$10 add on to the vehicle license fee continues on in perpetuity.
