PG. 2 OF 3		 Jamie answers to sheriff Doyle and manages the day to day operation of 200 employees The Major Crimes Task Force began in 1977 to primarily focus on narcotic related activity; This task force evolved to focus on major crimes even if not drug related The Major Crimes Task Force dissolved in October 2020 due to lack of funding Sheriff Doyle gave Jamie the reigns to begin a new unit to commit to unincorporated Marin as a narcotic investigative unit which came to be the SIU Novato, San Rafael, Fairfax, Mill Valley and Sausalito have opted out of being involved in the SIU SIU is not focused on the drug user but on the people selling the drugs to them The money that the county was providing for the Major Crimes Task Force was rolled over into the Sheriff's budget and is not funding the SIU They now have sobering/observation cells at the jail for folks coming in under the influence – they will be in that room for no less than 4 hours. Jail nurse and psych services are available to them The jail re-entry teams assists hand in hand with individuals to help them get back in to the community in a positive way The state recidivism is 55%; The Marin County jail recidivism rate is 34% There will be a Narcan distributing machine in the lobby of the jail. Folks will be required to watch a short video. This will also be available to the public and will be housed in the jail lobby. This will be available in about 3 weeks – May 1st.
