6:45 p.m.	<p>BHRS Director's Report – Jei Africa</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• BHRS and SAGA created a resolution to be presented to the BOS proclaiming June as Pride month• BHRS is working to improve capability to serve and become more welcoming to the LGBTQ+ population• More young people are seeking services within the BHRS system• Historical funding for Behavioral Health is being given by the state. Unfortunately, the challenge is that these funds are one-time.• SB803 – Peer Certification effort is moving forward quickly. BHRS is working to align their system with the statewide guidelines.• Last month Health Management Associates (HMA) were invited to start looking at what substance use services look like in Marin, including both public and private services. This 3-day process looked at how substance use services, especially in co-occurring settings be better supported, as well as bringing in more providers and work towards better coordination of services.• We had a very successful Mental Health Awareness month. Lots of speakers and panels on many topics such as focusing on men, older adults, LatinX and Asian communities. There is one that is really interesting focused historically on decolonizing Mental Health and what that looks like.

The MHB asked for Jenn Moore's assistance with this resolution and was brought to the CCAB. ➢ WET applications for this quarter's scholarship close this week and they are also working on an intern program. • AOD Board Liaison – Heather Johnson <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ Cat Condon and Mark Dale did a presentation on emerging trends in Marin. Some key points from the presentation were: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Accidental fatal overdoses have been increasing over the past 3 years especially in 2020 ❖ Fentanyl related deaths have increased 40% ❖ Non-fatal overdoses have been fairly stable / 62% of these have been alcohol related ❖ BHRS is exploring the alcohol issue with EMS and looking for potential solutions ❖ 1/3 of the opioid overdoses have been with people that are Medi-Cal eligible ❖ Data shows that Latin-X and Blacks have poorer treatment outcomes compared to white folks. There is a lot more exploration on this data. • BOS Updates – Supervisor Rice <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ The BOS had interns working hard to support programs for May Mental Health Month. Working on being mindful and talking about Mental Health in a way that becomes part of a normal community conversation. • CALBHB/C (as needed) – N/A • Events that MHB members will attend/have attended <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➢ Spahr Center are working on getting city councils to raise the Pride flag; go to Spahr Center website for rally dates/times as well as virtual events. ➢ Lisa Leavitt attended the most recent Suicide Prevention Collaborative meeting.
