6:45 PM	BHRS Staff Report: Jei Africa, BHRS Director and Cat Condon, Division Director, SUD will provide updates related to BHRS' response to the COVID19 pandemic including outreach efforts, continuation of essential services, etc. Information will also be provided on any statewide efforts to address Behavioral Health needs during COVD19.  • Work is being done with Social Changery to do a youth focused media campaign on education and prevention around cannabis with the first campaign focusing on Marin's Latinx community  • Preparing for annual external quality review which looks at access to care, timeliness and outcomes through data, focus groups and meeting with teams  • In addition to the lobby of the jail, the second Narcan vending machine will be at 120 N. Redwood which is the social services campus. The vending machine is being used more than anticipated and we've just been awarded 1000 additional kits by the state  • Planning, through RX Safe Marin, another community outreach event in the Canal neighborhood in mid-October  • Looking at data to see what kind of experiences folks are having in the system of care and looking for any substantial disparities that should be addressed.  • The admission to treatment data shows that 83% of African Americans are homeless at time of admission as opposed to 50% for Latinx and 58% being white.
