<p>Presentation: Revitalization of Golden Gate Village and other Marin Housing Authority Updates Speakers: Kimberly Carroll, interim Executive Director, Marin Housing Authority</p> <p>Transportation Partner’s Reports Golden Gate Transit (GGT) – Jon Gaffney reported on the following: GGT is still in the recovery phase of the pandemic. Ridership is down 16%. Ferry ridership is at 40% of pre-pandemic rides and bus ridership is at 45%.</p> <p>Housing Partner’s Reports</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PEP Housing – Mary Stompe reported on the following: PEP Housing provides housing to low-income and veteran older adults. PEP has 21 properties with the bulk of them in Sonoma County. They are currently working on a 60-unit project in Vacaville with 19 of those set aside for homeless older adults and another project in Petaluma has 19 units set aside for homeless veterans, 15 units for homeless older adults and 19 units for general population older adults. • EAH Housing - Bianca Neumann reported on the following: EAH Housing is headquartered in San Rafael and operate throughout the states of California and Hawaii. EAH develops and manages properties.
