6:10 PM	<p>BHRS Report / Discussion by Cat Condon</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discussion with BHRS Director Todd Schirmer & Cat Condon will be moved to December to review recommendations made by Interagency Collaboration to BOS. • 239 clients participated in a recent survey of BHRS services and the only area of dissatisfaction was with coordinated care • There is a new round of Opioid Settlement money coming to Marin County. There will be meetings with the Marin community on how to allocate these funds. It is close to 10 million dollars over 15 years. TBD. • New position @ Buckelew for Helen Vine Detox center. The position is to exam the Call back/ follow up for clients seeking treatment when the facility is full.
6:30 PM	<p>Discussion: Guest Speaker: Maurice Lee, CEO – Center Point</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maurice Lee, began his discussion with his personal history as a previous user of drugs, jail time and homeless. • He has worked in multiple settings in administration, treatment, hospitals, programs and has previously worked for Center Point And now has returned to the CEO position. • He reviewed the Continuum of care services provided by Center Point- inpatient, outpatient, residential, housing. • Contract with Marin County Sheriff's Office for inmates to be transferred by Reentry team for aftercare & treatment post incarceration. CenterPoint does assessments in jail. • There is a full curriculum of cognitive behavioral based programming in individualized case management, Criminal thinking, Life Skills Development, Anger management, vocational skills, mental health first aid, housing among other areas. • There are a variety of Federal grants for women, children, HIV, in housing, vocational training and mental health care.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clients start at the beginning of the Center Point system, outsiders cannot join services in the middle of the continuum. The focus is primarily on Addiction though the challenge is how to address overlapping mental health issue, a lot of dual diagnosis in clients. • Center Point Partners with a program in Santa Rosa that provides similar services • They do not provide detox as they do not have management for withdrawal. Maurice discussed the challenges of mental health care, stigma & outreach to Marin County • 7% of clients are women. The inpatient stay is from 60-120 days & that is not always enough time. Meth still outpaces opioid abuse, but alcohol treatment is still the number one problem. • Goal is to provide most services under one roof- mental health care (not severe), and medical. The disruption from sending clients out for care is a challenge thus the push to provide more at Center point. • Maurice open to providing tours to the Board and working with the Board <p>Questions from Board members were on the challenges Center point faces. Johnathan asked some questions about the housing piece of Center Point. One question from the public.</p>
