Community Partner Updates/Reports:

Kris Organ (CARA) -

- CARA is re-committing to the national effort to preserve and improve social security, Medicare and Medicaid.
- CARA Action Team (CAT) will be meeting this Wednesday at 11 a.m.

Luke Barnesmoore (Home Match) -

- The big fight ramping up is over the Home Safe program. The one-time funding has now dried up. A new funding allocation is needed.
- SB 37 for shallow rent subsidies passed both the house and the senate but was not funded in the budget so the governor vetoed it. The governor's office says they support the policy, but a funding stream needs to be identified.
- The language for the shared housing bill that will run in the next legislative session is in the process of being dropped.
- The other thing being looked at has to do with tenancy law, particularly the Lodge or Law because it is not enforced which creates confusion.

Ted Jackson (Marin Center for Independent Living) -

- MCIL is playing a wait and see game while congress is coming back together.
- One issue for MCIL is the reauthorization of the Work Incentives Opportunities Act (WIOA). Attached to
 this is the amendment of the reauthorization of the Rehabilitations Act which is MCIL's base funding. MCIL
 will be looking at advocacy around this.
- Waiting to see what the Governor's budget says when it comes out which will determine MCIL's initial advocacy steps.
- The Daylight Law affects the reduction of the overall number of parking spaces, which includes ADA parking spaces.
- There is a spot bill that hasn't been introduced yet which allows counties to do contract mode for IHSS protective supervision.
