

Zika Virus Exposure Patient Self-Assessment Form



Zika is a virus in certain regions that spreads to people through two specific types of mosquito or through sex with an infected partner. Most people with Zika don't get sick, so they may not know they have it. Those who do get symptoms may have fever, rash, joint pain and/or red eyes. If a woman gets Zika and is pregnant or later becomes pregnant, the virus can cause birth defects. **The following questions will help identify your risk of Zika virus exposure and determine if follow-up care is needed.** Please answer to the best of your ability.

Did You Know?

Zika virus can be spread through sex. Ask your doctor about ways to prevent spreading Zika virus if you or your partner have been exposed.

Ask Your Doctor:

If you are pregnant and answered yes to questions 1 or 4, you may have been exposed to Zika while pregnant or within the 8 weeks before conception. Ask your doctor about testing.
