

Marin County Guidelines for the Reporting of Tuberculosis

Diagnostic Criteria	Which Individuals to Report	Time Frame in Which to Report
PPD ≥ 5 mm or QFT+	Household or close contacts to a	1 week
AND Normal CXR	known active TB case*	
AND Asymptomatic	 Known HIV+ or at risk of being HIV+ 	1 working day
PPD ≥ 5 mm or QFT+	Household or close contacts to a	1 working day
AND CXR suggestive	known active TB case*	
of TB	 Known HIV+ or at risk of being HIV+ 	1 working day
AND/OR Symptomatic		
PPD ≥ 10 mm or QFT+	• 5 years of age or under	1 week
AND Normal CXR	 Clusters of individual recent 	1 week
AND Asymptomatic	converters (those with negative TB skin tests less than 2 years ago) in a school, daycare, congregate living, institutional, occupational, or hospital setting	
PPD ≥ 10 mm or QFT+	All individuals	1 working day
AND CXR suggestive of TB		
AND/OR Symptomatic		
TB Case/Suspect (Class 3/5)		
Routine PPD or Quantiferon-Gold result from all other individuals is <u>NOT</u>		
reportable.
