CRT 2.0 VISION STATEMENT

The goal of the Community Resiliency Team (CRT) initiative is to collaboratively build capacity and infrastructure in partnership with public, private, and philanthropic agencies to improve community awareness and knowledge of public health threats, prevention, and mitigation strategies, and increase access to support and resources. This report highlights the collective impact of our Marin CRTs from July - September 2025.

ABOUT THE COMMUNITY RESILIENCY TEAMS

The Community Resiliency Teams (CRTs) bring together neighbors, local leaders, and organizations across Marin County to strengthen our collective health, preparedness, and resilience.

Each CRT is led by a local Lead Agency that brings together “Zone Partners” — community-based organizations, schools, clinics, faith groups, city and county agencies, and more. Together with the County of Marin HHS and partners, we build connections and empower communities.

Through regular meetings, trainings, and events, CRTs turn data and feedback into concrete solutions that improve preparedness, health equity, and safety.

The CRT Zones and Lead Agencies are:

- Central Marin: BluePath Health
- Novato: North Marin Community Services
- San Rafael: Canal Alliance
- Southern Marin: Marin County Cooperation Team
- West Marin: West Marin Community Services and San Geronimo Valley Community Center

SUCCESS HIGHLIGHTS

Building a Culture of Preparedness

CRTs expanded community readiness this quarter through outreach, partnerships, and bilingual education.

- Each Lead Agency supported OEM's bilingual personal preparedness trainings. The goal of these classes is to inform, engage, and educate the community.
- Each Lead Agency provides virtual and in-person outreach and education to residents about AlertMarin to increase registrations.
- Each Lead Agency participated in their Zone's National Night Out events, highlighting their services, promoting AlertMarin, and sharing personal preparedness messaging.

Together, these efforts are creating a culture of preparedness across Marin's diverse communities.

Preventing Overdoses

The CRT Lead agencies participate in the OD Free Marin Education and Outreach Action Team. This quarter, they created bilingual Naloxone administration videos shared on [Instagram](#) and [Facebook](#). These videos reached over 21,500 views.

During this quarter, a community member in West Marin used naloxone from a CRT-installed box to reverse an overdose and save a life.

CRTs continue to lead with compassion and collaboration, ensuring lifesaving tools are available when and where they're needed most.

Increase Access to Services

CRTs also advanced access to essential services like Medi-Cal and CalFresh.

- All Lead Agencies distributed HHS materials through food pantries and/or outreach events.
- These materials include flyers for CalFresh and MediCal, as well as for Marin HHS Community and Educational Events.
- SGVCC and WMCS focused on bilingual support and equitable access in their SMARTIE goals.

Each connection brings Marin closer to a community where everyone can get the help they need.

Building a Resilient Future

Every effort — from installing Naloxboxes to hosting preparedness trainings — reflects the CRTs' shared commitment to care and collaboration. Together, Marin's CRTs are building a more resilient, informed, and connected community for all.
