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MHSA and BHRS UPDATES

- MHSA Three Year Planning: Tentative timeline: Focus groups should finish up in January. Online input on priorities should be set-up Feb/Mar. Draft Plan posted early May.
- PEI Mid-Year Report: Not required this year.

ACCESS LINE – Katie Fleck

Katie provided an overview about Access Line and answered questions. *See handouts provided.*

- Medi/Medi clients: Can get med management at County, but have to find MediCare covered therapy. Hard to find.

DATA COLLECTION

- Satisfaction Survey: earlier in the year I provided an updated version that had revised language about the cultural competency of the services. Please use new version.
- Referrals to County Access Line: A template log is provided for collecting info on referrals to Access for Mental Health services. That info will be provided to BHRS at the end of the Fiscal Year.
- Demographics: The final version of the demographics form will be translated into Spanish and Vietnamese and provided for use. Early Intervention programs must use it starting 7/1/17. We will discuss how implementation is going, make revisions, and then all PEI programs will use it starting 7/1/18. For programs using the old demographic categories, they can be used to populate the new categories for the end of the year report. When there is missing data, it will be reported as “decline to state” and a description of the reason for significant amounts of missing data will be included.
